

Fairfield has had another excellent year with regards to our sporting successes in school and we couldn't be prouder of what our pupils have achieved this year!

Joel Smith is our third student to be awarded a DRET Odey Scholarship for his achievements in table tennis. His last competition in June saw him win the regional U11 boys, under 13 boys and runner up in the under 15 boys singles and we look forward to hearing how he progresses in this sport in the future.



We have been honoured to have had two Olympic athletes visit Fairfield this term. Back in June, we welcomed back British sprinter, Mark Lewis-Francis, who spent the morning working with our year 5/6 athletics team in preparation for the DRET Summer Cup. This was followed by a visit from Chris Tomlinson (former British record holder in the long jump). His inspirational assembly was enjoyed by the whole

school and led way to an exciting day full of masterclasses and Q&A sessions across all year groups. Chris was genuinely impressed with the athletic talent displayed by many of our children in KS2!



At King George Stadium, several children in year 2 had their first taste of representing the school at an athletics competition earlier this month. They finished an impressive 8th out of 22 teams. Over the last few months, the year 5/6 teams have taken part in many more regional competitions including tennis, cricket and rounders, with the netball, tri-golf and year 5 orienteering team all progressing to the county finals at Hymers College in Hull last Friday.

However, this year's crowning glory has to be Fairfield's victory at the DRET Summer Cup held in Grantham this month, which saw our swimming, hockey and athletics team compete against all other primaries across the trust. After narrowly missing out on first place last year, the children came back fighting and were well-deserved of the winners' trophy. A special mention has to go to the athletics team who won their events and Finlay Brown who claimed our first ever gold medal in swimming!



Finally, we would like to say a huge thank you to all of the friends and family for their continued support at this year's sports days. Every child who competed showed great enthusiasm and sportsmanship and Beech were crowned the overall champions once again!
