
### Year 3/4 Magna visit

## Year 6 leavers play



# The Ørsted Wonderful World Adventure Trail at the Great Grimsby 10k



Get out, get active and join a journey of discovery at this year's Grimsby 10k Race, on 21st July



Ørsted's Wonderful World Adventure Trail is being set up by sponsors Ørsted to help young children (4-7 years) and their parents get comfortable with discussing climate change. Families taking part will receive a new children's book, entitled "Is This My Home?".

The illustrated book follows the journey of a little girl and her mouse friend as they travel around the world. It introduces the idea that our home is bigger than just our house or our town, and that we all have a role to play in looking after it.
